VEGETABLE HIGHLIGHTS

BEANS

3,274,000 packages of beans were shipped by Florida growers during the 1988-89 season, a light increase over the 3,266,000 shipped in 1987-88.

Dade County is the predominant bean production area, with supplies from November into May, with other areas of South, Central, and North Florida having significant supplies in the early Fall and late Spring.

Growing conditions were generally favorable throughout the season. Central Florida shippers were in the deal well into December this season, due to warm weather. All growing areas experienced various degrees of cold damage from a hard freeze on February 24th. Most beans in South Florida escaped damage, but growth was retarded. In the West Central area damage was extensive to the limited early planted acreage.

Prices at shipping point ranged \$7.50-\$11.00 for round green type in bushel hampers and crates in the Fall months. Prices during December through the end of season in May were mostly in the \$13.00-\$20.00 range. Growers also marketed notable volumes of Pole type, Kentucky Wonder type, and Wax type beans this season.

Florida beans are packed in bushel hampers, crates and cartons.

CABBAGE

Florida growers shipped 4,221,000 crates of cabbage during the 1988-89 season. This was a slight decrease from the 4,223,000 crates shipped during the 1987-88. Acreage planted during 1988-89 was scattered over North, Central & South Florida. Large blocks of acreage could be found in Flagler and St. Johns counties in North Florida, Manatee & Sarasota counties in W. Central Florida, in St. Lucie county and in the Lake Okeechobee area.

Prices for the season per carton or crate medium-large size ranged mostly \$4.00-\$5.00 with peak prices in late May of \$8.00-\$12.00.

Round green type cabbage was packed in a 1 3/5 and 1 3/4 bushel crates, 50 pound cartons and 50 pound sacks. Light amounts of Red and Savoy types were also produced.

CARROTS

Florida shipped 1,259,000 sacks of fresh market carrots during the 1988-89 season. This was a 33 percent decrease from the previous season, when 1,883,000 sacks were shipped.

Growers shipped an additional 661,000 cartons of miniature type carrots in the 1988-89 season, compared to 750,000 cartons in 1987-88.

Growing conditions were good until late February when freezing temperatures damaged the crop in Central Florida. Regular type carrots are mostly grown in the Central Florida area, while the miniature type is grown in both the South and Central areas.

Prices for regular type carrots ranged from \$5.00-\$10.00, mostly \$6.00-\$8.00, per sack of 48-1 pound film bags medium-large size.

Prices for miniature type carrots per carton of 20-12 ounce film bags ranged \$5.00-\$6.00 from November through March and \$10.00-\$12.00 from mid-April through mid-June.

CAULIFLOWER

Florida growers shipped 130,000 packages of cauliflower during the 1988-89 season, compared to 282,000 packages in 1987-88.

Due to an insufficient number of regular handlers, no Cauliflower F.O.B. was issued.

CELERY

Florida growers shipped 4,020,000 crates of celery during the 1988-89 season. This was a slight increase compared to the 3,950,000 crates shipped during 1987-88.

Early transplanting was completed generally on schedule and growing conditions were generally good. Yields this season were comparable to last season.

The main growing areas for celery are the Lake Okeechobee section in South Florida and the Zellwood section in Central Florida.

Prices ranged from \$4.00 to \$17.00 per crate of 2 dozen stalks during the season, with peak prices of \$12.00-\$17.00 from late April through mid-June.

Celery varieties were mostly unchanged. The fourteen inch wirebound crates remained the principal shipping container.

CORN

Florida growers shipped 7,153,000 crates of sweet corn in the 1988-89 season, a decrease of over 15 percent compared to 8,439,000 crates shipped in 1987-88. This decrease was due to the diversion of early season acreage to the production of seed corn.

Growing conditions were good early in the season. However, the spring harvest was delayed by the replanting of much of the crop due to cold damage in late February. Heaviest shipments were in the months of May and June.

The main growing areas for corn is near Lake Okeechobee and Zellwood, with smaller acreage in Dade County and near the coast at West Palm Beach.

Prices for yellow corn ranged from \$5.00-\$14.00 during the season. Highest prices were generally in December, January and April.

The main variety of yellow corn grown is Summer Sweet, with light volume of Winter Green, Bell Ringer, and Guardian. A lighter quantity of white corn was available during the season.

CUCUMBERS

Shipments of Florida cucumbers for 1988-89 totaled 5,422,000 as compared with 4,803,000 packages for the 1987-88 season, an increase of nearly 13 percent.

Cucumbers are grown throughout Florida, with the major producing areas in the southeast and west central areas of the State. The fall harvest lasted from October to mid-January, with warmer than usual growing conditions for that period. Florida cucumber supplies are almost non-existent from mid-January to March. Spring supplies from south Florida were heaviest from mid-March to mid-April. West Central growing areas suffered extensive damage to newly planted fields and had to replant causing a delay of 3 to 4 weeks in spring supplies from that area. Total cucumber supplies were most plentiful during April through early June.

1 1/9 bushel cartons of waxed medium size were selling mostly at \$6.00-\$12.00 in the fall season. Prices during March through mid-June ranged from \$5.00-\$25.00, mostly \$12.00-\$16.00.

Florida cucumbers are packed mostly in 1 1/9 bushel cartons and 24 count cartons of medium-large sized fruit.

EGGPLANT

Florida shipments of eggplant for the 1988-89 season were 1,367,000, an increase of 22 percent compared to 1,117,000 packages moved the previous season.

Eggplant is grown in most areas of Florida, but the southeast area around Pompano Beach accounts for most supplies. Growing conditions were good in the fall as warm weather continued into early February. Freezing temperatures occurred in late February throughout the growing area, but the crop experienced minimal damage. Ample supplies were available throughout the season.

Prices for bushel and 1 1/9 bushel cartons generally ranged \$4.00-\$8.00 during the entire season.

Eggplant is packed mostly in bushel and 1 1/9 bushel cartons, with most southeast area growers using the bushel cartons. Italian type eggplant is packed in 1/2 bushel cartons.

ENDIVE-ESCAROLE

In the 1988-89 growing season, Florida growers shipped 1,168,000 crates of endive and escarole. This a decrease of over 16 percent compared to the 1,399,000 crates shipped during the 1987-88 crop year.

The primary growing sections for endive and escarole are the Lake Okeechobee area in South Florida and the Zellwood area in Central Florida.

Prices per 1 1/9 bushel crate started in early November with endive at \$3.00 and ranged mostly \$3.00-\$5.00 during the season, with peak prices of \$8.00 in May. Escarole started at \$4.00 and ranged mostly \$3.00-\$6.00 during the season, with peak prices of \$8.00 in May.

The major shipping containers are the 1 1/9 bushel wirebound crate and a carton containing 24 heads.

LETTUCE

During the 1988-89 season Florida growers shipped 1,499,000 cartons of Iceberg lettuce, compared to 1,664,000 in 1987-88. According to the Statistical Reporting Service, the acreage of all types of lettuce in Florida in 1988-89 was 11,800 compared to 11,700 the previous season.

The ICEBERG type represented about 82 percent of all lettuce shipments. ROMAINE accounts for nearly 10 percent, and other types (BOSTON, BIBB AND LEAF) make up about 8 percent.

Nearly all Iceberg type is grown in the Lake Okeechobee area of South Florida. Romaine, Boston, Bibb and Leaf types are grown in both Central and South Florida. Highest prices for Iceberg type was in the first months of the season, December and January, when the market ranged from \$8.00-\$14.00 per carton 24s. During the remainder of the season, February through mid-May, prices mostly ranged \$5.00-\$8.00.

ROMAINE type ranged per carton 24s from \$4.00-\$8.00, with the higher prices December through January. BOSTON type generally ranged \$4.00-\$8.00, BIBB \$3.00-\$6.00, and LEAF type generally \$3.00-\$6.00.

The Romaine type is also packed in 1 1-9 bushel containers.

PEPPERS

Bell pepper shipments from Florida for the 1988-89 season were 11,581,000 packages, a 9 percent increase compared to shipments of 10,597,000 packages the previous season.

The southwest area continues to be the major production area, followed by the southeast, west central, and north Florida areas. Growing conditions were generally good most of the season until late February when a hard freeze occurred statewide, except in southern areas. The Southeast experienced little cold or wind damage. The Southwest had light to moderate damage from wind and cold. The West Central had extensive damage to recently planted crops, some replanting was done.

F.O.B. Shipping point prices on California wonder type green 1 1/9 bushel cartons large size generally ranged from \$6.00-\$9.00 during the season, with the peak prices occurring in mid-April and early May from \$12.00-\$24.00.

Bell peppers are packed in 1 1/9 bushel containers, with most packed in cartons and a few packed in crates.

PEPPERS OTHER

Florida growers shipped 1,295,000 packages of other type peppers during the 1988-89 season compared to 1,160,000 packages in 1987-88. These shipments were made up of Cuban type peppers packed in 1 1-9 bushel cartons and crates. Longhots packed in bushel and 1 1-9 bushel cartons and crates, and Fingerhots, Hungarian Wax and Jalapenos packed in 1/2 or 5/9 bushel cartons. These other type peppers are grown in all areas of Florida, with only South Florida in harvest through the winter.

SOUTH FLORIDA POTATOES

The 1988-89 Potato winter crop acreage in South Florida was estimated at 7,300 acres, a slight increase compared to the 7,100 acres the previous season.

Round red potatoes, with a few round whites, are grown in the Stuart, Fort Myers and Dade County areas. Most south Florida potato production is in the Dade county areas. Earliest harvest began in the Stuart area in mid-January, followed by the Fort Myers and Dade County areas, where all shippers were working by late February. Growing conditions were good in all areas with quality through the season. Although there was some cold weather in late February, no damage was noted in South Florida. Almost all harvest was complete by the end of April. Prices for 50 lb sacks round reds US No. 1 grade size A were \$15.00, from mid-February until mid-April. Then prices declined to \$10.00-\$12.00 at the close of the season in April. Light supplies of Round Whites, mostly LaChipper variety, US No. 1 size A were \$20.00 from late February through mid-March.

Most South Florida potatoes are packed in 50 lb paper sacks, but some move in 40 lb cartons. Truck transportation is used to move most of the south Florida potato crop, with only a few by rail-truck.

NORTH FLORIDA POTATOES

This area centers around Flagler, Putnam and St. Johns Counties (Hastings area). The National Agriculture Statistics Service estimates 25,500 acres for harvest in the Hastings area, 1,000 less than the previous season. However, other producing areas in north Florida (Suwannee County) and including central Florida areas were estimated at 6,500 acres, an increase of 4,000 acres compared to the 1987-88 season.

Planting was completed by mid-March due to the need to replant some fields lost to the late February freeze. Harvest began in mid-April with reduced yields caused by the late February freeze. Heaviest shipments occurred through May and the first week of June, with peak movement the week ending May 20th. Very light movement continued through mid-June. Processing stock potatoes moved mostly on contract. Contract prices ranged from mostly \$6.00-\$6.25 bulk per cwt. Most movement on the open ranged between \$15.00-\$25.00, mostly \$15.00 bulk per cwt through brokers and other dealers.

Table stock prices ranged from \$10.00 to \$26.00 with most movement at \$10.00 per 50 pound sack, U.S. One size A. Due to the strong market for processing stock some potential table acreage went for processing, especially early in the season. Light acreage of Reds were also planted.

Trucks were generally used for shipping the crop. A relatively small volume of the crop was moved via rail-truck (piggyback vans).

RADISHES

There were 6,194,000 cartons of radishes shipped from Florida in 1988-89. This was an increase of over 20 percent compared to the 1987-88 shipments of 5,132,000 cartons. Growing conditions were generally good and general harvesting started about the same as the previous season.

Prices at shipping point for Red Globe type packed in cartons of 30 - 6 ounce film bags ranged generally from \$2.00 to \$6.00, with a peak of \$8.00 in mid-March.

Some red radishes were also packed in cartons containing 14 - 1 pound film bags, 24 - 8 ounce film bags and 40 pound film bags. White radishes were packed in cartons containing 24 - 8 ounce film bags.

Radishes were shipped by truck and rail-truck (piggyback vans).

SQUASH

Shipments of Florida squash came to 3,737,000 packages (bushel equivalents) for the 1988-89 season. This was an increase of over 14 percent compared to the 3,229,000 leaving the state in the 1987-88 season. Both summer and winter type squash are grown in Florida. Zucchini, Yellow Straightneck and Yellow Crookneck are the major summer types, and there is light production of White Scallop. Winter types include Acorn, Spaghetti, Butternut and Buttercup, of which Acorn and Spaghetti make up the most volume. Squash is grown throughout Florida, with the major producing area being the southeast section, followed by the southwest, west central and north Florida areas. Fall growing conditions were generally good and volume was heavy. Cold temperatures and wind in late February caused extensive damage in the southwest areas, and the southeast areas had some damage causing light supplies in March. Some replanting was necessary in southeast areas.

Shipping point prices for 1/2 or 5/9 bushel cartons or crates small Zucchini ranged mostly \$4.00-\$8.00 during most of the season. Peak prices of \$20.00-\$25.00 occurred during early March. The same size pack of Yellow Straightneck traded mostly in the \$6.00-\$10.00 range during the season, with peak prices of \$15.00-\$25.50 during March. 3/4 bushel crates of small Yellow Crookneck mostly ranged from \$6.00-\$12.50 during the season. Highest prices were in late February and March, ranging \$12.50-\$25.50.

With the exception of Yellow Crookneck squash, all summer types were packed in 1/2 or 5/9 bushel cartons or crates. Yellow Crookneck squash is packed in 3/4 bushel crates. All winter types are packed in 1 1/9 bushel cartons and crates.

STRAWBERRIES

Florida strawberry acreage for the 1988-89 season was 5,300 acres, up from 5,000 acres in the 1987-88 season, with the majority of acreage in Hillsborough County centered in Plant-City-Dover area.

Florida shipments for 1988-89 season were 4,806,000 flat cartons. This was an increase of nearly 8 percent, compared to the 1987-88 shipments of 4,453,000 cartons. The major container for shipping continued to be a flat containing 12 pints. Most movement was by truck with loads generally palletized with 96 flats per pallet.

Planting began in late September and was completed by mid-November. The major variety planted was Selva, followed by about equal amounts of Chandler and Pajaro.

Significant harvesting started in late November. Supplies increased through early January, then slowed until heavy spring harvest began in February. Due to increased acreage of the early bearing Selva variety, shipments were heavier in January and February than in previous years. Peak volume occurred the week ending March 25. Volume declined sharply after the week ending April 1. Due to a combination of good market conditions through March and lessened availability of supplies in April U-Picking of fields in April was significantly less this year. Only very light shipments continued into May.

The shipping point prices per 12-1 pint flat ranged from \$8.00 to \$20.00 in December and January. During the heaviest period of shipment (the month of March), prices ranged from \$4.00 to \$8.00. Prices ranged from \$4.00 to \$6.00 for the lighter April harvest.

TOMATOES

Florida growers shipped 59,602,000 25 pound cartons during the 1988-89 season. This was a slight increase compared to the 1987-88 season when 59,134,000 cartons were shipped. Significant shipments of tomatoes began in the Quincy area in early October and in the Palmetto-Ruskin area in mid-October. Movement continued to increase in volume through November and early December, peaking the week ending December 3rd. Shipments declined the weeks ending December 10th and 17th, and then remained fairly steady through the week ending January 7th. Movement decreased through the remainder of January, bottoming out in mid-February. Shipments increased on an erratic basis in late February and March. Shipments in April decreased as effects of a late February freeze in the Immokalee-Naples and Palmetto-Ruskin districts were felt. Shipments increased through most of May as later fields and replanted acreage in the Palmetto-Ruskin area came into production, with peak shipments for the Palmetto-Ruskin district occurring the week ending May 27th. Light volume was shipped from the Quincy area during June with production decreased due to continued above average rainfall during much of the month.

Prices received during the 1988-89 season generally ranged from \$5.00 to \$18.00, the highest being in early May when production had been down due to the losses from the late February freeze, and the lowest in early January, per 25 pound carton of 5x6 size mature greens.

CHERRY TOMATOES

In the 1988-89 growing season 2,064,000 12-pint flats of Cherry type tomatoes were shipped from Florida. This was a slight increase compared to the 2,061,000 flats shipped during the 1987-88 season. Cherry type tomatoes are grown in all areas of the State where other tomatoes are grown. The most volume is grown in Central Florida for Fall and Spring harvesting, followed by the South Florida areas for mostly winter harvesting.

The shipping point prices ranged from \$3.00 to \$13.85 per 12-pint flat, including palletizing and cooling.
